Policy Statement

The main production activities at William Pollard & Co Ltd., are litho and digital printing. On a daily basis we carry out various printing and finishing operations, demonstrating a 'duty of care' in both innovative processing of raw materials, and subsequent treatment of production waste into re-useable resources where ever possible. Our aim is to reduce the consumption of paper, card, mineral resources and fossil fuels and support the government programmes of, re-use, recycle, and minimisation of waste to landfill.

We provide an auditable process for dealing with our waste so that it has the least impact on the environment. However, we do recognise that printing and support actions collectively may have an impact on the environment, therefore it is our responsibility to reduce these impacts to a minimum, prevent pollution and be committed to continual improvement in these areas.

In order to meet these commitment we have established a comprehensive Environmental Management System (ISO 14001:2015). This enables us to operate in accordance with UK environmental legislation and where possible exceed all its relevant regulatory requirements.

This policy integrates principles, programmes, techniques and practices into a dynamic management system that guides the Company's managers and staff to ensure that environmental and sustainability are always considered in the performance of their duties.
